Your Vote is Your Voice (from NC Data - October)

Election time is here! Are you concerned about teacher pay, recruitment of high-quality teachers, or retirement benefits? From the local school board to state leaders to Congress, your vote is your voice. Early voting starts October 20; Election Day is November 8. Find out who is on your local ballot at www.ncsbe.gov. Changes in Licensure, Compensation (from NC Data - October)

You may have heard about the proposal to change teacher licensure and compensation pathways in NC. The commission working on the proposal plans to vote on a final version by October to send to the State Board of Education. The Legislature may vote on the plan as early as January 2023. NC DKG and DKG International Scholarships

There will be two Doctoral scholarships and one Post-Baccalaureate scholarship available this year through NC DKG. Scholarship applications are due by February 1, 2023. The NCDKG scholarship forms are linked on the state website, along with an applicant checklist. NC DKG members may apply for both a NC DKG and an international scholarship within a given year. The membership requirement for International applicants is three years and for NC DKG applicants is two calendar years following induction. The international forms are available under the Apply/Submit tab of the DKG member website.

Minutes of the September 26, 2022 Meeting (Wilson Community College)

President Christine Gilmore called the meeting to order, welcomed everyone, acknowledged the hostesses, and thanked members for bringing the food for our salad/dessert dinner and school supplies for our active teachers. Gilmore then presented an inspiration, "Always Room for a Friend", relating a story of a teacher filling a jar with golf balls, then pebbles, then sand, then 2 beers representing friends and family, job, everything else, and beer respectively.

Meredith Fychok led the induction of our newest member, Tricia Hester.

Robin Williams, Executive Director of Wilson Educational Partnership presented our program describing the work of WEP over its 33 years. Presently the focus is on Teacher Support and Student Support. During the pandemic, WEP produced 65 videos for teachers to use about "Learning with the Locals." The latest project has been Communicating with Confidence, first presented in 2 Junior English classes at Hunt, next year increasing to all Junior English classes at Hunt and 1 at Fike, then progressing to all Junior English classes in Wilson County Public Schools.

Gilmore recessed the meeting and the members enjoyed a dinner of various salads, desserts, and fellowship.

Gilmore called the Business portion of the meeting to order.

The minutes from our May meeting, having been distributed by email previously, were approved.

Treasurer Marsha Irvin gave the Treasurer's Report. The present balance is \$7540.41.

Corresponding Secretary Susie Pope stated she had sent cards to Marsha Irvin and Jean Yelverton.

Fychok reported that nominations for new members would take place at our November meeting.

Communications chair Dana Skinner stated her committee needs 1 more caller.

Past President Dot Carter represented Omicron at the NC DKG Executive Board Meeting September 23. She told Omicron there are 22 \$500 grants available from NC DKG Educational Foundation. The Foundation is having its annual golf tournament in Thomasville and requested Omicron sponsor a hole. This motion was seconded by Rose Bissette and passed unanimously.

Under Old Business, Gilmore and Pat Campbell led a discussion of our Westview House Reading Project. It was decided we would try again to read to any children there and definitely support the collection of books for the children's library.

Our next meeting will be Monday, November 7th at the new YMCA at 4:30 pm. Our service project will be collecting goods the after-school program needs. Pat Campbell moved that \$75 of the \$129 set aside for Westview use be used to purchase a set of books for the YMCA middle school students. Bissette seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Omicron's next service at the Soup Kitchen is October 31, 2022. Either Irvin or Martha Wrenn will send email for volunteers.

With no other announcements, Gilmore adjourned the meeting at 6:45 pm.
