

In Memory of Dr. Janice Thompson (August 26, 1934 – July 25, 2022)



Dr. Janice Thompson was inducted into DKG - Omicron in October, 1964 (58 years ago!). When Dr. Thompson was healthy and lived at home (Clinton, NC), she would attend every Omicron meeting even though she lived 70 miles away. She served as Program Chair (1978 - 1980). Dr. Thompson was a very intelligent, kind "life-long learner" with an eye for detail and a twinkle in her eye. She kept us "on our toes", making sure our grammar, prose, and pronunciations were correct. She felt it was an honor to be a DKG member and Omicron was honored to have her as a member. A life-long learner, Dr. Thompson held degrees in English from East Carolina

University and earned her doctorate in English from UNC-Chapel Hill. She was awarded the Gilbert-McNairy Scholarship (1971-1972) and the UNC Department of English Scholarship (1972-1973). Early in her career, she taught at Pine Level High School, Princeton High School, and Greene County Central High School. Moving to the college-level instruction, she taught at Appalachian State College, UNC-Chapel Hill, then finished her long career at Sampson Community College. In 1971 she was awarded a Fulbright Lectureship and taught at Ludwig Maximilian University in Munich, Germany. In addition to teaching, she also served as Liaison Specialist for Support Services in the NC Department of Public Instruction. Locally, she judged 4-H speeches, VFW speeches and essays. She published 2 articles on Caroline Howard Gilman in American Authors Dictionary.

Dr. Janice Thompson will be missed.

Minutes of the May 10, 2022 Meeting (Wilson Arts Center)

Omicron was declared Excellent on the Chapter Achievement Award, Excellence for our Web site, and Excellence for our Newsletters. Carter encouraged members to apply for the NC DKG EF grants for teachers in the classroom, conferences, or community projects.

Congratulations to Elm City Middle School assistant principal, Morgan Stephenson, for earning her Masters in School Administration.
